Hi Paul,

To get started it might be helpful to break down the basics of a conservation plan. Purpose of a conservation plan is to protect inventoried and other significant features and resources through voluntary and/ or regulatory means.

- Presents a vision for the future ecological health of an area.
- Based on and references a natural resources inventory
- Describes an action plan to protect inventoried and other features over a long period of time.

I have several resources I would suggest to help you get started.

Preparing a Conservation Plan is a Cooperative Extension guide that provides an overview of the basic elements in a conservation plan.

Hi Barbara --

As you know, our Selectmen have put forward a warrant article that would decrease funding of the town's Conservation Fund from LUCT proceeds. The Deliberative Session is this Saturday, and I plan to make a motion to amend it to essentially nullify the article, and I am confident I will have to votes to amend it.

This "opportunity," however, has heightened our awareness that we do not really have a plan for land conservation in this town, and I'm going to ask the Commission to form a Land Conservation Working Group consisting of 3 Commission members (to avoid a quorum), together with at least that many other townspeople, to formulate a Land Conservation Plan that can have wide visibility to and input from the community. Problem is, I really don't know what such a plan is, or how to go about doing it. Can you help? To get the Working Group started, I have pulled together a large "Land Conservation Resource Documents" loose leaf notebook with absolutely everything I can think of that relates to the subject of Land Conservation in Atkinson, including much of the material you recently sent me, and this information is also available on line, here:
