
Completed the blazing in Yellow of the Pine Knoll trails today. The double loop trail it appears is currently being used and maintained by local trail bikers (mountain bikes)...makes for an interesting path over boulders, tight corners around trees and the installation of a couple small bridges. On the southern most point of the second loop I stumbled across an old man-made "cave" constructed on granite stones...maybe a cold storage cellar...too well constructed for a kids fort. Chick on the AllTrails link below for pictures. I linked Crown Hill and Pine Knoll trails together by a trail (corridor) blazed in Red. Off of this corridor is a trail blazed in Yellow that leads uphill to the second entrance point to the trails off Crown Hill Road. All in all, trails are in good shape, little required maintenance, and are easily connected and joined to both the Plaistow and Hampstead trail systems. Trails blazed in Red lead to both the Plaistow and Hampstead trail systems. Trails blazed in Red lead to both the Plaistow and Hampstead trail systems conservation trails for both Crown Hill and Pine Knoll are blazed in Yellow. I did an extensive search of a new, 1940 tri-town marker and found nothing. Apparently, the old tri-town marker is accepted as the official boundary marker, although the GPS coordinates of AllTrails do not concur. I am still looking for Noyes Rock. I added a couple more loop trails in Crown Hill (next trail map e-mail) but did not see a large rock of significance...couple of out-cropping ledges may be possibilities.

Next, on to Stickney Land trails...and finish up with Marshall Land. Bugs are still not a factor but rising temps are.
