after he has been presented with a written specification of the reasons. Upon such suspension or dismissal, he shall be entitled to a hearing, on the merits and reasonableness of the action, in superior court in the county in which the municipality is located provided that he petitions the clerk of the superior court for such hearing within 10 days of his suspension or dismissal. The court shall have the power to affirm, modify or negate such suspension or dismissal, based upon its findings."

Philip Consentino said that he is presently covered under RSA 105 which reads the same up to and ending at...all department equipment. He explained that he would like RSA 105:2a for better job security. He feels that proper channels would be followed for dismissal or suspension and that a decision would be made by an unbiased party.

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Article 24 Passes.

ARTICLE 25: Raymond Fournier motioned to accept; Barbara Snicer seconded. To see if the Town will vote to designate, as permanent Atkinson Town Forests, the following land parcels; The former Chadwick parcel, 28.4 acres; the Chadwick Parcel connector, .173 acres; the former Slade parcel, 11.67 acres; and the former Marshall parcel, 35.17 acres; and to authorize that the Conservation Commission be empowered to manage these parcels as Town Forests under the provisions of RSA 31:112 (11).

Chester Ladd said that if the town is serious about a forest management program it should pass this article. Help from the State to manage these lands would be available. Edward Rudulski wanted to know if the State or the Federal governments would be aiding? Pointed out that the Federal government is considering posting No Trespassing on their property which would make this land unaccessible to the Townspeople. Also wanted to know what RSA 31:112 (11) says. Carol Grant replied that in fact if Federal funds are used there may be no No Trespassing posted on lands involved. Chester Ladd said that the RSA states that the land can be used for conservation or passive recreation purposes and that no permanent building can be erected; no school can be put in there.

Article 25 Passes.

ARTICLE 26: Raymond Fournier motioned to accept; Barbara Snicer seconded. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Ninety Four Dollars (\$3,594.00) for the purpose of drilling a new well at the Kimball Public Library for Town use.

Evelyn Shore asked what type of well this would be. Carolyn Orr said that it would be an artesian well.

Article 26 Passes.

ARTICLE 27: Raymond Fournier motioned to accept; Barbara Snicer seconded. To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Mosquito Control Commission.

ARTICLE 28: Raymond Fournier motioned to accept; Barbara Snicer seconded. To see if the Town will vote to accept Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) in perpetual care funds for the Harold and Ann Clark lot.
